MTM has also founded Y.U.G.O. (Young Adults United for Global Outreach), Global Leadership Training Center, a program designed to teach global strategies that will empower leaders to impact nations, and Sister to Sister, an international outreach to women in foreign countries. Dr. Bailey-Jones has focused her efforts in the 10/40 window, which includes North Africa and the Middle East, an area that is the most populated, but least evangelized in the world.
