- If you are a member of another ministry you can adopt a team, individual team member or project to commit to support in prayer.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q. Where does Global Impact serve?

A. The Global Impact Movement serves locally here in Detroit, across the United States, and in other countries such as Kenya, Jamaica, South Africa and many other places.

Q. How long are the teams gone?

A. Teams traveling outside of Detroit are usually gone from one to three weeks depending on the project.

Q. How much does it cost?

A. The cost of short term missions trip range from \$300.00 to \$3,000.00 depending on location.

Q. Who pays for the trip?

A. Because the needs around the city, country and world are so great, participants are required to fund their trips by raising support from friends, family, church members and personal funds.

Q. What is the cost for families?

A. The cost for the trip is usually based on the number of participants. There is no family plan or reduced cost for families.

Q. What all does the cost cover?

A. The cost of the trip covers transportation, housing, and food. Any other charges made during the trip are the responsibility of the participant.

Q. What if I can't afford it?

A. Occasionally a team member raises concerns about not being able to go due to lack of funds. God's provisions are unlimited and together as members we can come up with a viable plan to procure the needed funds. Our track record has been miracle prone; supernatural provision; at times "not enough became just enough", then "just enough became more than enough."

Q. How do teams travel?

A. Travel is done usually by cars and air depending on the destination. International teams travel by air of course.

Q. What are the accommodations?

A. Accommodations vary depending on the location. Teams have slept in church sanctuaries, homes and hotels.

Q. What duties are involved?

A. Opportunities to serve can consist of manual labor, skilled labor project, teaching and discipleship, conference assistance, evangelism and whatever other support is called for at the time.

Q. Are children allowed to go on missions trips?

A. Children strongly encouraged to attend missions trips as early as possible. However, a parent must accompany any child under the age of 15, unless the team traveling is targeting a specific age group.

Q. How do I get started?

A. Prayer and discernment will direct your right actions in determining the type of mission and location that need your gifts. Once you have determined Gods call to action then sign up a the reception counter in the church lobby and collect the information for your trip.
